Activity	<p>Spend the morning exploring Castle Rushen in Castletown, the ancient capital of the Isle of Man.</p> <p>Explore one of the best preserved castles in the world! Originally built for a Norse king in the 12th century and later besieged by Robert the Bruce, the castle has been a royal residence and a prison!</p> <p>Plates will not be ready for collection until at least a week later.</p>

Transport	Will be provided to and from activity venues.
Equipment to bring	<p>Appropriate comfortable clothing for the weather – there will be quite a lot of walking!</p> <p>You may wish to bring money to purchase snacks or a small souvenir.</p> <p>Do not bring anything valuable that could be lost or damaged as the school will not be held liable. You are required to take responsibility for all your own equipment and property.</p>
Meal Arrangements	<p>Packed lunch or money to purchase lunch at the Co-op in Castletown.</p> <p>You may wish to bring extra snacks and drinks.</p>
PLEASE NOTE:	<p>Please remind students that during the trip there will be periods of minimal supervision and that they must stay in allocated groups if they do not wish to stay with the Trip leader. They are not allowed to shop alone, wander around activities alone or go outside the area that will be designated by the Trip Leader.</p> <p>Students will have some free time in Castletown before crafts. This will only be allowed if excellent behaviour is shown in the castle.</p> <p>Acceptance and participation on this trip is subject to adherence to the School's Code of Conduct on behaviour. Any student who has shown, or does show a persistent reluctance to adhere to it, may be removed from the trip without reimbursement.</p>
