Activity	<p>The Curraghs Wildlife Park is a wonderful place to see conservation programmes in action preserving and helping breed endangered animals in wetlands; to see other endangered species including large cats, birds of prey, primates and Meerkats too; walk along one of the many Trails including the Nature Trail and complete the questions to be in for a chance of winning a prize in groups! There is also the Butterfly Trail and Year 7 also learn about Food Chains.</p> <p>A new exhibit is underway and likely to be open by Activities Week called “The Lemurs of Madagascar” and you could be the first to see a new species to be housed there called red-ruffed lemurs! The park has a range of Adventure playgrounds and attractions such as the giant jumping pillow, miniature railway and mini diggers.</p>

Equipment to bring	<p>Students need to wear appropriate sturdy footwear and clothing for the location and weather. This may include bringing waterproof clothing or sun hats and sun cream just in case so please check the weather forecast prior to the day and make sure your child is dressed accordingly. Students will need a pen or pencil.</p> <p>Do not bring anything valuable that could be lost or damaged as the school will not be held liable. You are required to take responsibility for all your own money, equipment and property.</p>
Meal Arrangements	Bring plenty of water. Packed lunch, drinks and snacks and a suitable bag to carry it in. A small amount of money may be brought to purchase souvenirs or extra snacks and drinks at the park or to purchase lunch at the park.

Please remind students that during the trip there will be periods of minimal supervision and that they must stay in allocated groups. They are not allowed to go to the shop alone, wander around activities alone or go outside the area that will be designated by the Trip Leader.</p> <p>Acceptance and participation on this trip is subject to adherence to the School's Ready to Learn Policy on behaviour. Any student who has shown, or does show a persistent reluctance to adhere to it, may be removed from the trip without reimbursement.</p>
