EXTENDED PROJECT QUALIFICATION

The EPQ provides an opportunity for a student to pursue their own academic interests in any chosen topic.

Independent research is undertaken which develops a range of skills as well as providing an opportunity to gain additional UCAS points for an application to university.

Students receive support throughout the qualification, with access to a supervisor who will cover a range of study skills such as research methods, writing techniques and referencing, and is aimed at providing a real experience of university style learning.



PASTORALSUPPORT

We are extremely proud of the extensive range of pastoral care we offer our Sixth Form students.

We recognise that students require the correct support and advice to enable them to develop as independent learners, to prepare them for their academic study but also for life beyond Sixth Form.

Students are allocated to a tutor group with a Personal Tutor who meets tutees regularly to discuss progress, concerns and to set personal goals for the future. Tutors will also support students in their transition from school to Higher Education, employment and apprenticeships. We recognise that students require the correct support and advice to enable them to develop as independent learners, to prepare them for their academic study but also for life beyond Sixth Form.) Our dedicated Pastoral Support is a non-teaching member of staff who is available to students to provide individual support plans. Additionally we provide mentoring sessions to students who require specific help in key areas, for example, personal organisation, time management, revision techniques, etc.

SPORTS LEADERSHIP AWARD

The Sports Leadership Award is a great opportunity for our students to learn and demonstrate important life skills, such as effective communication and organisation, whilst learning to lead physical activities with younger people, their peers, older generations and within the community.

The course involves both guided and peer-to-peer learning as well as supervised leadership, to ensure that learners have all the skills they need to lead others.

Students will plan, lead and evaluate sports/physical activity sessions over a number of tutored hours and then demonstrate their leadership skills as part of their assessment.

PROGRESSION PATHWAYS

UCAS - the university process

Most of our Sixth Form students decide to take up the offer of Higher Education and they are given an enormous amount of practical guidance and help from Personal Tutors as well as the Head of Sixth Form in making their choices.

There is an annual Higher Education Visit where, over the course of a week in the UK, a variety of universities are visited, enabling students to judge for themselves which type of institution may best suit their requirements. Students stay in university halls of residence to complete their experience.

There are also opportunities for students to receive guidance from former students, who have been to university and are keen to offer a unique insight.

Employability and Pathways Programme

Some of our students choose to move directly into the world of employment. To support them we have a dedicated Employability Co-ordinator who provides numerous opportunities for students to make contact with local businesses. Students are also able to access the Careers Service in school for interviews and to gain help and advice regarding job searching.

Through our Sixth Form Employability and Pathways programme, we give our students the opportunity to access a wide range of speakers and workshops on a variety of careers and pathways. Seminars are provided on writing a CV, letters of application, preparing for interview and interview skills.

In Year 12 students are given the opportunity to embark on a work placement alongside their academic studies. The work placement allows students to develop their soft skills, enriches their CV and gives them a greater understanding of employment and the overall requirements in their desired career area.

LIFE IN THE SIXTH FORM

The School Day

The Sixth Form Collaborative Study Room is open daily from 8:00am until 5:00pm and students are welcome to use the facilities during this time. Registration is compulsory for all students and begins promptly at 8:40am. Each day has six periods that are 50 minutes long. Students have in-school private study periods and are expected to use this time effectively.

Pastoral Care

We are extremely proud of our extensive range of pastoral care we offer Sixth Form students.
