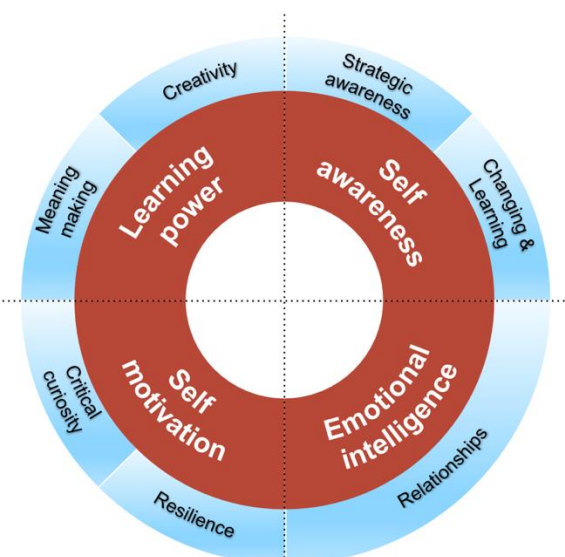
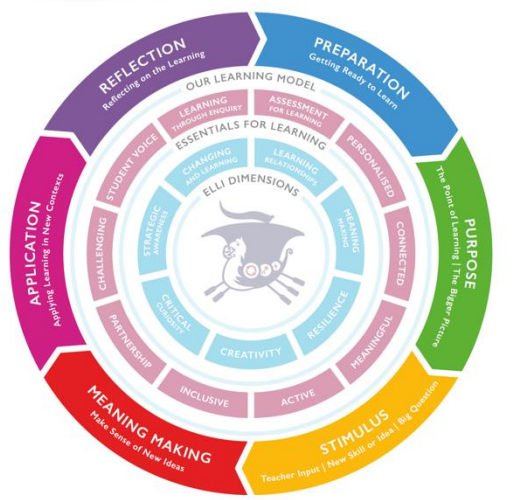
THE TEAM

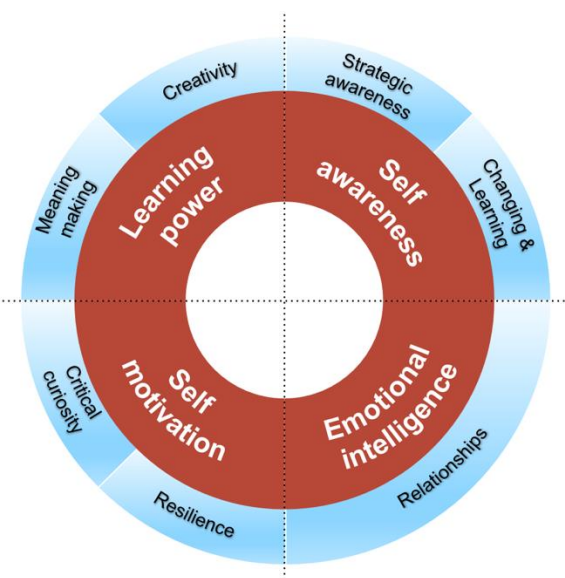
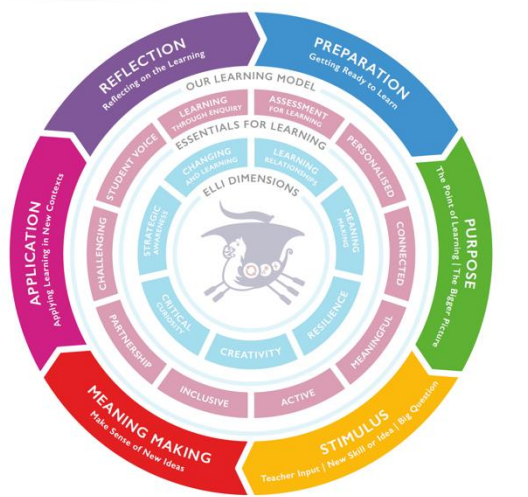
YEAR 12 - EXPECTATIONS

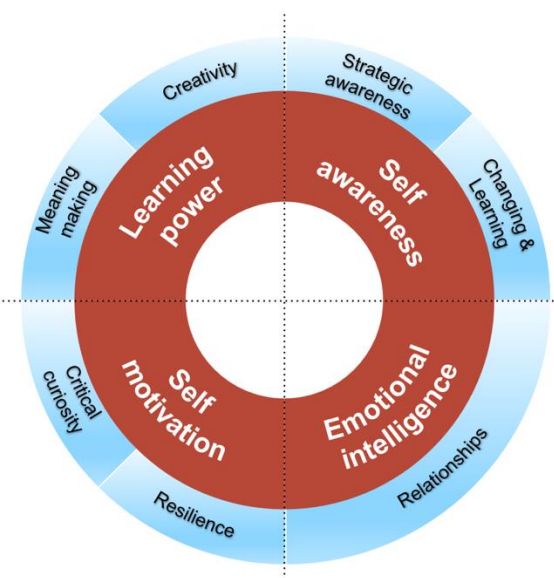
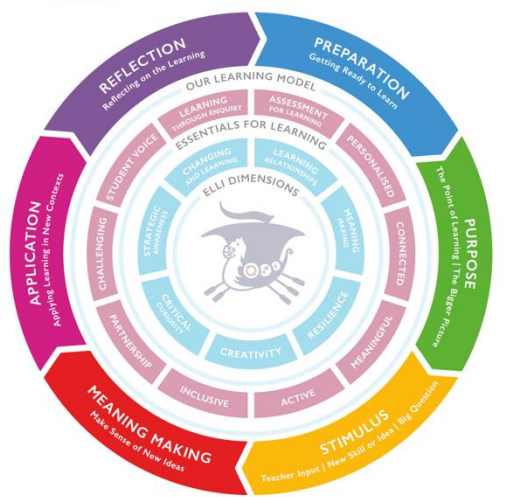
YEAR 12 - EXPECTATIONS

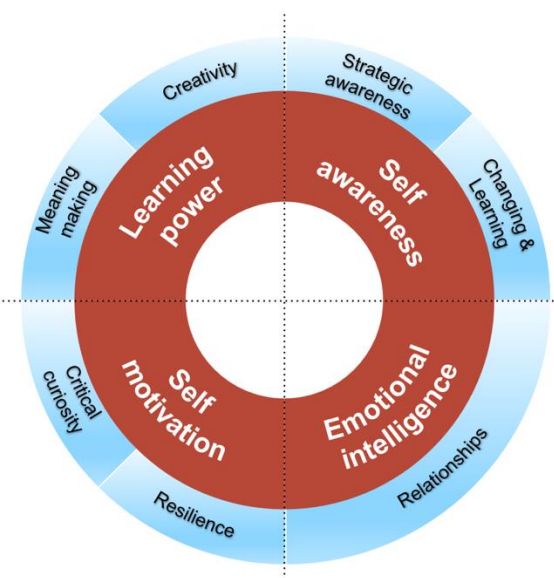
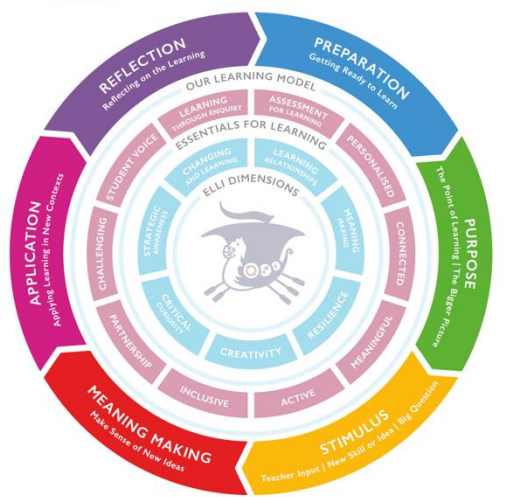
YEAR 12 - ORGANISATION

- Poor organisation is the biggest barrier in Sixth Form
- Be disciplined in your studies
- Complete homework/revision in the first 24 hours of being taught
- Attend after school supported study sessions
- Create good routines from the start
- Keep to subject specific deadlines
- Request one-to-one support (to help with time management/organisation/study skills/revision plans, etc...)
- Opt into seminars to support learning

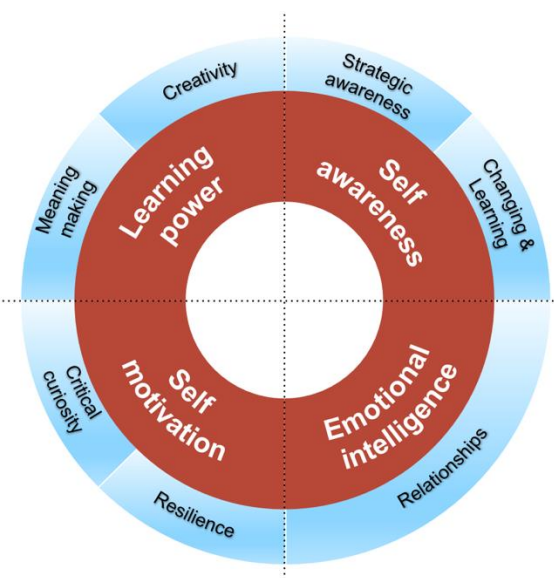
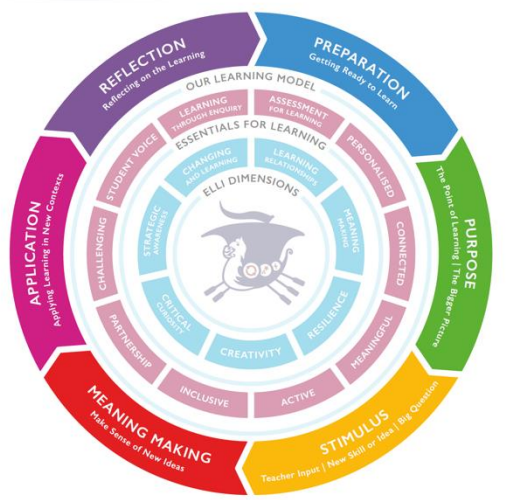
YEAR 12 - EFFECTIVE STUDY

- Find a good study space/working environment
- Try not to multi-task
- Reduce hours in part-time employment
- Limit use of mobile phone whilst studying
- Look at study/revision strategies (study-buddy)
- Use school facilities before (starting 8:00am) or beyond (until 5:30pm) compulsory school hours
