



Qualifications




- A qualification shows what you have learnt and what you can do
- There is a large variety, so are grouped together into levels
- Levels are based on the standards of knowledge, skill and competence needed for each qualification







External Assessments




- The "grade" of a qualification is determined by how well you perform in assessments
- Each course has its own unique mix of assessments
- The assessments are determined by the awarding body (exam board)







A KS4 timetable




- 30 lessons (6 lessons a day)
