Create a character profile for Gretel in The Boy in the Striped Pyjamas
Week 3
Approximately 1 to 1 ½ hours
Week 4
Revisit relevant sections of <i>The Boy in the Striped Pyjamas</i> , paying close attention to Gretel's character. Complete the Character Profile : Use the provided template to gather detailed information about Gretel. Make sure to include insights into her personality, relationships, interests, emotional state, and worldview.
Analytical Skills: The ability to look closely at how characters act, what they say, and how they relate to each other in the story. Research Skills: Knowing how to find examples in the text that support your ideas about the character and help explain their traits. Reflective Thinking: Reflecting on how a character's experiences shape their thoughts and feelings, and understanding why they react the way they do. Organisational Skills: Being able to arrange your ideas and details about the character in a clear and structured way. Interpretive Skills: Learning to read between the lines and figure out the hidden meanings in the story, which helps you grasp the overall message. Empathy: Developing an understanding of what a character is feeling and going through, which helps you connect with different perspectives. Critical Thinking: Evaluating a character's choices and growth in the story, encouraging you to think more deeply about the plot and its themes.
This work will be re-visited in class to use as a tool for end of term assessment. There will also be the opportunity for peer assessment.
 1. The Text Itself Reread Key Chapters: Focus on chapters where Gretel has significant interactions with Bruno, their parents, and other characters. Highlight or take notes on her thoughts, feelings, and behaviours. A PDF copy of the novel is available on Google Classroom. 2. Class Notes and Discussions Review Class Materials: Refer back to their notes from class discussions, which may contain insights into Gretel's character and the themes of the book.
