# BBC School News Report Video Checklist

#### Script & Structure

- Engaging introduction (Who? What? Where? When? Why? How?)
- Information presented in a logical order
- Strong conclusion or call to action

#### Presentation & Delivery

- · Clear and confident speaking
- Appropriate tone and language for a news report
- Eye contact with the camera and natural body language

## Fairness & Accuracy

- Facts presented impartially (no bias)
- Sources credited properly
- Sensitive topics handled appropriately

#### Filming

- Steady camera shots (no excessive shaking)
- Good lighting and clear audio
- Mix of shots (interviews, location footage, relevant visuals)
- Smooth transitions and clean editing

## Video Editing

- Video length: Minimum 3 minutes, Maximum 4 minutes
- Captions/subtitles included for accessibility
- On-screen graphics (e.g., lower-thirds for names, location, or key facts)
- Intro and outro elements (e.g., title screen with "BBC School News Report")
- Background music/sound effects (used appropriately and not overpowering dialogue)
- **BBC-style branding** (if applicable, consistent fonts/colours)
