
Key Dates

Remembrance

As part of the commemoration of those who lost their lives during battle, Lower School students will once again be representing the school at Onchan Remembrance events on Saturday 9th November and Sunday 10th November. If your child would like to join me in representing the school on either of those days, please ask them to collect a letter from the main office. In addition, the school will be selling poppies and associated items. Please do send your child into school with some lose change if they wish to make a donation in exchange for a poppy or similar.

Reminders

As the weather turns colder over the coming weeks, I would like to remind students to remember to wear a warm coat to and from school. Students are expected to go outside at breaks and lunchtimes once they have finished in the canteen, so it is important that they dress appropriately for the Manx weather! They can collect coats from their lockers before they go outside.

We have had some communication from Bus Vannin regarding incidents of poor behaviour on the school buses on the way home from school, in particular the 33 route. Stops around the Willaston area have only recently been reinstated at our request and Bus Vannin have asked us to remind students that if poor behaviour continues, they will withdraw those stops again and students living in that area will need to walk home. I would be grateful if parents could remind their children about the importance of behaving appropriately when travelling on the school buses.

I would also like to remind parents that the school car park should not be used for dropping off and collecting children at the start and end of the day, unless you are a blue badge holder. Please use the clearly marked drop off zone on the left as you enter the school drive.

Thank you for your continued support and I would like to take this opportunity to wish you all an enjoyable half term and we look forward to welcoming our students back to school on Monday 4th November.
