Year 10 UCM classes will take place in UCM classrooms on Friday afternoons. Students commence these subjects on the understanding that they are required to make their way to the correct UCM building during Friday lunchtime and on Wednesday mornings students begin school at the start of period 2.

## Y9 Options - Criteria for Success

Studying at Key Stage 4 is much more demanding than at Key Stage 3. There is a significant amount of knowledge to memorise, concepts to understand and skills to develop. To be successful you need to:

- Attend regularly to prevent gaps in your knowledge.
- Positively participate in activities to build understanding and develop skills.
- Consistently complete independent learning (homework), to complete tasks, practice skills, develop understanding and revise content.

A good attendance record, a good behaviour record and a good homework record are therefore three criteria that all courses have. If one or more of these criteria is below what is expected, then it is likely that we would have to review your suitability for a particular course.

## In addition:

Some courses have non examined assessments (coursework) that require students to perform at a certain standard/skill level prior to starting the course.
